#### From the Head End

I'm both happy and relieved to finally report that we've completed the movement of our three locomotives formerly located in Brightside Yard. Gerry Feeney and the PLA switch crew had us spotted on Hearst interchange by about noon, we took time to make final preparations and we

waited for the Union Pacific crew to come up from Warm Springs. They appeared right around 5 pm and after a bit of switching we were ready to go. While it was a long cold night on the train as we made our way from Hearst to the Suisun interchange, we arrived at about 6:30 Sunday morning, tired but relieved that everything had gone well.

California Northern showed up on Tuesday morning to help finish the job, getting us to the NWP interchange at Lombard by about 11 am, and early Tuesday afternoon NWP came down to take us the last miles to Schellville. By late afternoon, everything was spotted in Schellville yard safely and we started for home.

I've seen a number of nice photographs from this trip- and this issue of the Dispatcher's Sheet is devoted to sharing some of those photos. While this equipment movement was essential to our success in the North Bay, it is also one of those rare moments in railway preservation that we, as an organization can take pride in.

There is a long list of people who helped us complete this movement. On behalf of the organization, I'd like to thank Union Pacific, California Northern and Northwestern Pacific and our PLA switch crew for making sure that we got to Schellville safely. The photographs tell a great story, and I think that it's best to let them speak for themselves right now rather than adding too many additional words. Know that our organization has been truly fortunate to have been part of something that is essential to our continued success, but more importantly benefits railway preservation and our mission. In the coming months, we will have more to say, but right now, I don't have the right words to capture the true significance of this important event.
